General Requirements

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GENERAL UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

Critical Progress is the minimum grade indicated in specific courses to demonstrate proficiency and progress in major. Earning less than the minimum grade is a trigger for a conversation with advisor.

(1) UCC: Students must meet the University Core Curriculum (UCC) requirements. For a full list of UCC courses, see <http://undergrad.fiu.edu/advising/university-core-curriculum.html> or speak with your advisor. Students requesting to be transient must receive permission from the School of Communication and Journalism.

(2) Civic Literacy (CL) : The Civic Literacy requirement is a statewide mandate that applies to undergraduate degree-seeking students initially entering a Florida State University System (SUS) and/or Florida College System (FCS) institution as a degree seeking student in the 2018-19 academic year and thereafter. ¿

Requirement: Demonstrate civic literacy prior to graduation through one of two options presented below. No other courses or credit-by-exams may be used to satisfy this requirement. Transfer courses from outside a Florida public college (FCS) or university (SUS) may not be used to satisfy this requirement. ¿

Ways to satisfy the Civic Literacy Requirement: ¿

Option 1: Take a Course. Complete either POS 2041 or AMH 2020 beginning Fall 2018 and onward, which is when the new course competencies and outcomes were inaugurated. Both courses are part of FIUs University Core Curriculum (UCC) Social Science Group One category. ¿

Option 2: Take the CIV 2222 Florida Civic Literacy Test course offered through FIU Center for Testing at <https://testing.fiu.edu/>

(3) Global Learning: Freshmen entering FIU Summer B 2010 or later must take at least two Global Learning (GL) designated courses at FIU. See <http://goglobal.fiu.edu>. Courses must be:

- 1 GL foundation course, which must be taken from the University Core Curriculum (UCC).
- 1 GL discipline-specific course (3000/4000 level)

(4) Summer Hours Requirement: All students entering FIU or any university within the State University System (SUS) of Florida with fewer than 60 credit hours are required to earn at least nine credit hours prior to graduation by attending one or more summer terms at a university in the SUS.

(5) Gordon Rule: All Gordon Rule courses (i.e., UCC Communication, UCC Mathematics, and Gordon Rule with Writing (GRW) courses) must be completed with a minimum grade of "C." This requirement must be fulfilled within the first 60 credits. Students are required to complete at least two Gordon Rule with Writing (GRW) designated courses.

(6) Foreign Language Requirement for Graduation (FLENT/FLEX): A student who did not complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or at a post-secondary institution must successfully complete 8-10 credit hours of instruction in one foreign language prior to graduation. Exceptions include appropriate CLEP, AP, IB, TOEFL, or transfer credit. Contact your advisor for more information.

(7) UCC Mathematics: Math courses are categorized into either Group One or Group Two. One math course from each group is required unless the first math taken is from Group Two and has an immediate prerequisite in Group One. In this case, students will take two Math courses from Group Two. However, one of the two Math courses must have a MAC, MGF, or MTG prefix.

(8) GENERAL ELECTIVES: Must be taken outside of the School of Communication and Journalism.

Transfer students are assumed to have completed an Associates of Arts Degree from a Florida Public Institution or completed 60 credits and the University Core Curriculum Requirements.

In addition, the following courses are required of incoming transfer students:

Global Learning Requirement for Transfers: Transfers entering FIU Fall 2011 or later are required to take two Global Learning courses.

Those who meet University Core Curriculum Requirements prior to entering FIU

-Two Global Learning Discipline Specific Courses (One of the two may be a Global Learning Foundation Course chosen in consultation with your advisor)

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Those who do not meet University Core Curriculum Requirements prior to entering FIU

- One Global Learning Foundation Course (from the University Core Curriculum)
- One Global Learning Discipline Specific Course

College of Communication, Architecture + The Arts: School of Communication + Journalism (SCJ):

Grades: All students must successfully pass MMC3003 (Journalism + Media Orientation), and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.85 (this includes all transfer work, in addition to current FIU work).

Writing Proficiency: All students are expected to demonstrate proficiency in writing. Students are required to enroll in a writing course and receive a "C" or higher.

Graduation Policy:

A student must have a minimum 2.75 GPA in all SCJ courses and outside courses required by the program to be eligible for graduation.

SCJ Track Electives Courses (15 credits): MMC3932C Intense PODS (register for three sections as one section is 1 credit). Students will select 12 credits from a provided list of courses to satisfy this requirement.

Area of Concentration: (12 credits)

Students must select four upper division level courses in one subject area outside of SCJ. Student should consult with their academic advisor when choosing the area of concentration. Students must earn C or higher in courses to be used toward the Area of Concentration.

International Relations & Political Science: INR, CPO, POS, POT; Psychology: CLP, DEP, EXP, INP, PPE, PSY, SOP; History - AFH, AMH, ASH, EUH, HIS, LAH, WOH; Criminal Justice - CCJ, CJC, CJE, CJJ, CJL, DSC; Anthropology/Sociology: AND, ANG, ANT, SOC, SYA, SYD, SYG, SYO, SYP; Global and Sociocultural Studies: GEO3421, GEO3471, GEO3502, GIS3048; English: AML, CRW, ENC, ENG, ENL, FIL, LIT; English-Business Writing - ENCC3213, ENC3204, ENC3249, ENC4260; Art/Photography: ARH, ART, GRA, PGY; Religion: REL, ASN, HBR, etc. Students may also choose a variety of Business Minors and Certificates.
